Pentecost - Come Holy Spirit!

This weekend, as we celebrate Pentecost, we mark the birthday of the Christian community, our Church. Though culture, circumstance, and surroundings remove us from that fearful assembly receiving God's Spirit for the first time in human history, we're very much the same as them. We're called, just as they were, to gather ourselves together, delight in the nourishment that comes from Sacrament and community, and then to allow that strength and joy to drive us out into the world, where we act and exist in ways that draw more people to what we've found in friendship with God. The Spirit calls us to this life, strengthens us for it, and reminds and guides us along the way. It's because of the Spirit that we can have the confidence we do in our discipleship. The Church is many things, but at her core she is a vessel for God's Spirit, poured forth into this world. That's why we pray, again and again: Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of the faithful, kindle in them the fire of your love.

PAPAL VISIT TO CANADA // Earlier. the Vatican formally announced that Pope Francis will travel to Canada from July 24-29. The historic visit, focused on Indigenous healing and reconciliation, will be the fourth papal journey to Canada and the first since Saint John Paul II's visit in 2002.

The trip is intended to be a followup to the Pope's apology offered on April 1st. But this visit from our pope won't be the end of our efforts for truth hand reconciliation.

The Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops announced a nation-wide collective financial commitment in the amount of \$30 million dollars to support healing and reconciliation initiatives for residential school survivors, their families, their communities and our Church. Our own diocese has agreed to pledge the sum of \$400,000.

Our Parish is happy to contribute to these efforts for truth and reconciliation. A new group is being formed to address these issues and to see how we can grow through this process. Those interested in assisting (especially those with an indigenous, First Nations or Metis background) are encouraged to reach out to our pastor.
