About the Paschal Candle

The Paschal Candle represents Christ, the Light of the World. The pure beeswax of which the candle is made represents the sinless Christ who was formed in the womb of His Mother. The wick signifies His humanity, the flame, His Divine Nature, both soul and body. Five grains of incense inserted into the candle in the form of a cross recall the aromatic spices with which His Sacred Body was prepared for the tomb, and of the five wounds in His hands, feet, and side.

During the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday night the priest carries the candle in procession into the dark church. A new fire, symbolizing our eternal life in Christ, is kindled which lights the candle. The candle, representing Christ himself, is blessed by the priest who then inscribes in it a cross, the first letters and last of the Greek alphabet, (Alpha and Omega `the beginning and the end') and the current year. The Easter candle is lit each day during Mass throughout the Easter season until the Solemnity of the Ascension. It is also lit at every Baptism and Funeral.

CHRISM MASS - MONDAY, MARCH 25TH

Each year during Holy Week the Chrism Mass is celebrated at the Cathedral Church of St. Peter-in-Chains in Peterborough. During the Mass the Priests of the Diocese renew their commitment to priestly service. Bishop Daniel Miehm blesses the oil of catechumens (Baptism) and the oil of the sick (Anointing of the Sick) and consecrates the oil of chrism (Baptism, Confirmation, Ordination of clergy and the consecration of altars). The oils are then distributed to clergy to be used during the year for their local communities. Everyone is warmly invited to join Bishop Miehm, Fr. Jerry and our clergy at this Mass.

PASTORAL REFERENCES

Students and teachers applying for a position with a Catholic School Board must have a pastoral reference from their parish priest. It is a prerequisite. Please be aware that Fr. Jerry will only provide references for registered parishioners who are personally known to him. Attendance at Sunday Mass is expected and participation in parish ministries is a definite plus when applying for any teaching job.
