BREAKING OPEN THE WORD

When the scribe asks Jesus which is the "first of all the commandments," Jesus answers by giving him not one, but two: love God and love neighbour. Further, Jesus connects these two commandments: loving God with all our being is one and the same as loving our neighbour, made possible only by self-giving. Such all-embracing love "is worth more than all burnt offerings and sacrifices" of grain or animals, for, when we love as Jesus commands, we ourselves are the "burnt offerings and sacrifices."

CATHOLIC FUNERALS

For Catholic men and women, death is a reality faced in the company of Jesus Christ, the Resurrection and the Life. It's not so much a celebration of someone's life, as a celebration of God's saving love. Catholic Funerals have three distinctive steps: 1) A Vigil of Prayer at the Funeral Home; 2) A Funeral Mass at the parish church; 3) Burial Rites at the cemetery or mausoleum. In answer to a much asked question: yes, Catholics may be cremated, but cremated remains should be buried with dignity in a consecrated space.

HOSPITAL STAYS

Due to privacy laws, the hospital does **not** provide us with a list of Catholic patients as was the practice in the past, even if you give them information about your religious affiliation when admitted. This is just a reminder that if you find vourself or a loved one in the hospital and wish to have a visit from Father, please contact the office so we don't miss vou!
