JUBILEE 2025: PILGRIMS OF HOPE

On Christmas Eve at St. Peter's Basilica, Pope Francis symbolically opened the holy door that marks the Jubilee year, which happens every 25 years. This Jubilee is the Year of Hope, and will run until the Feast of the Epiphany on January 6, 2026. While only Rome has formal holy doors, the Diocese of Peterborough is offering Jubilee pilgrimage sites where indulgences may be obtained as part of this very special time for the Church.

The Pilgrimage Churches in the Diocese of Peterborough are:

The Cathedral of St. Peter-in-Chains (Peterborough), St. Patrick's (Kearney), St. Mary's (Lindsay), and St. Michael the Archangel (Cobourg).

A Jubilee Year is a time for forgiveness and renewal in our relationship with God. Jubilee years were initially marked in Scripture by the remittance of debt and property, and the healing of relationships. The Holy Father desires that this Jubilee Year will be a "moment of genuine, personal encounter with the Lord Jesus, the 'door' (cf. Jn 10:7-9)" (Spes Non Confundit, 1).

No matter who you are, or where you are on life's journey, you are welcome here!

Sunday of the Word of God

In 2019, Pope Francis instituted the Sunday of the Word of God as an annual celebration on the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time. Today is a great time to remember that we encounter Jesus Christ when we read the Scriptures. Reading the Bible is not merely an intellectual encounter, but it is spiritually nourishing as well.

FEAST OF ST. BLAISE

Christians endure illness and physical suffering in this life as all people do. However, our faith reminds us that suffering will not have the last say. Not only that, but Jesus' own suffering becomes an invitation for those who are sick or suffering to turn to Him as the true remedy of all torments. So, we ask for the intercession of the saints to help us turn to Our Divine Physician and entrust all those suffering and sick into his care. One way Catholics have traditionally done this is through the blessing of throats on the feast of St. Balise, Bishop and Martyr which will be available after all Masses on the weekend of February 8/9th.
