Mary and Joseph were faithful to the law when they came to present their forty-day-old Son in the temple and offer the prescribed sacrifice. Simeon and Anna show us, however, that more is necessary than obedience to the law in order to recognize the presence of the Son-Messiah. Filled with expectation, they were actively waiting and looking for "the Christ of the Lord" and the "redemption of Jerusalem." Their very expectation and waiting was the work of the Holy Spirit within them. As with Simeon and Anna, our own lives must be filled with the expectation and waiting that is truly the work of the Holy Spirit within us. Only then will we see and recognize the Messiah in our midst.

### FEAST OF ST. BLAISE

Christians endure illness and physical suffering in this life as all people do. However, our faith reminds us that suffering will not have the last say. Not only that, but Jesus' own suffering becomes an invitation for those who are sick or suffering to turn to Him as the true remedy of all torments. So, we ask for the intercession of the saints to help us turn to Our Divine Physician and entrust all those suffering and sick into his care. One way Catholics have traditionally done this is through the blessing of throats on the feast of St. Balise, Bishop and Martyr which will be available after all Masses on next weekend.

### WORLD DAY OF THE SICK - MASS WITH THE HOLY ANOINTING OF THE SICK

When Pope John Paul II established the World Day of the Sick on the memorial of Our Lady of Lourdes on **February 11th** each year, he was "reminding us to see in our sick brother or sister the face of Christ", and of our own need for healing and the Church's care for those who are ill and those who care for them.

On Wednesday, February 12th at 6PM we will celebrate a special Mass for the Anointing of the Sick. Please extend an invitation to those Catholics in your families or your neighbours whose health is seriously impaired by sickness or old age, as we would be happy to anoint them during Mass.

Finally, a reminder that if you have a loved one who is homebound, or seriously ill, please call the parish office to arrange for Fr. Jerry to come for a visit and offer the Holy Anointing of the Sick.

Jesus, Our Lord, we ask you to have mercy on all who are sick. Give them your strength and love and help them carry this cross with faith. May their sufferings be one with yours, overcome the power of evil and lead others to our Father in Heaven. Lord Jesus, hear our prayer, for you are Lord forever and ever. Amen.
