In Lent, we experience a few liturgical changes during our worship:

- The Gloria is not sung and the word 'Alleluia' is also not said or suna.
- For the **Profession of Faith**, we will use the Apostle Creed (instead of the Nicene Creed).
- The ending of the **Universal Prayers** shifts to: "Lord, in your mercy" and we respond: "Hear our prayer."
- The sung **Parts of the Mass** (Holy, Mystery of Faith, Great Amen. Lamb of God) will be chanted without musical accompaniment.



This past Wednesday we began the Lenten Season with our celebration of Ash Wednesday. The three pillars of Lent are Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving. It is through the observance of these three Lenten practices that we hope to enter into Lent as one person and to step out into Easter as a better, more Christ-like version of ourselves.

We have a number of Lenten activities happening:

JUST FOR LENT: THE MASS Thursdays at 6:00PM

EUCHARISTIC ADORATION Fridays from 12:30PM until 1:30PM

SOUP & STATIONS OF THE CROSS Fridays Soup 5:15PM; Stations 6PM

FRIDAY WITHOUT MEAT

Meatless Fridays are a timeless tradition in the Catholic Church. The simple act of abstaining from meat joins us to the sacrificial heart of Jesus. We encourage every parishioner to adopt this penitential practice on the Fridays during Lent.

FASTING ISN'T JUST ABOUT FOOD

Catholics traditionally fast from food during Lent, but perhaps we should look beyond what we eat. Have you ever thought of fasting from the media devices which dominate much of our lives? The silence that follows is an invitation to prayer and meditation. Trv it!

CONFESSIONS

Experience the healing power of unconditional forgiveness. Father is available to hear confessions on Saturdays between 3:00PM-3:45PM in the Confessional and during Adoration on Fridays. If it's been a while or you don't know how to start - don't worry....Father will help you through it. Don't let the sins of the past weigh you down.
