### WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY

January 18–25 is the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. This year's prayers and reflections have been prepared by the faithful of the Armenian Apostolic Church, together with their brothers and sisters of the Armenian Catholic and Evangelical Churches. The theme for 2026 is drawn from St. Paul's Letter to the Ephesians: "There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling" (4:4). The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity reminds us that unity is not merely an ideal, but a divine calling at the heart of our Christian identity, inviting us to grow more deeply in the fellowship we share in Christ, who unites Christians throughout the world. ### BILL C-9 AND RELIGIOUS FREEDOM

Bill C-9 is federal legislation currently before Parliament that proposes amendments to the Criminal Code related to hate propaganda, hate-motivated offences, and access to places of worship and community spaces.

Of particular concern is a proposed change that would remove an existing protection in Section 319(3)(b) of the Criminal Code, which has long ensured that individuals cannot be convicted of hate-speech offences for expressing religious beliefs or teachings, in good faith, grounded in sacred texts and longstanding religious tradition.

The Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops has expressed concern that removing this provision could create uncertainty around ordinary religious expression, pastoral teaching, and public witness. In response, the bishops have written an open letter to the Prime Minister and other federal leaders, urging that freedom of religion, conscience, and expression be clearly safeguarded. As Catholics, we are invited to stay informed, to pray for our leaders, and to engage respectfully and thoughtfully in matters that touch on faith, justice, and the common good.
